How do I apply for admission?

2. Be a junior or senior.
3. Request and schedule a program through the home school counselor.
4. Be recommended by the home school.

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What does it cost?

How do I get there?

What about credits?

LACC currently offers two credits per year per course. All credits accumulate toward graduation requirements and may be used at some colleges to meet entrance requirements. Dual credit courses can gain you college credit at Heartland Community College or Joliet Junior College and/or advanced placement.
