After applying for a tool donation request, Milwaukee donated almost \$20,000 worth of tools to the program. We are incredibly grateful for this donation, and the students have been ecstatic to use these high quality tools.

Our own Jodi Lancaster worked hard all summer to apply for Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Prize for Teaching Excellence. On October 24th, we were so pleased to discover that Jodi had won 2nd place. Jodi won a total of \$50,000. \$35,000 of that goes right back to her Welding program, and she gets \$15,000 for herself. We could not be more proud of Jodi's hard work and dedication, and are honored to have her on the LACC team.


